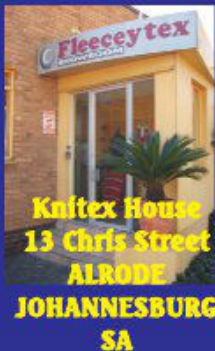

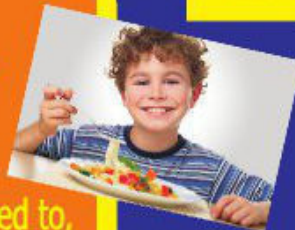


SAY A PRAYER...

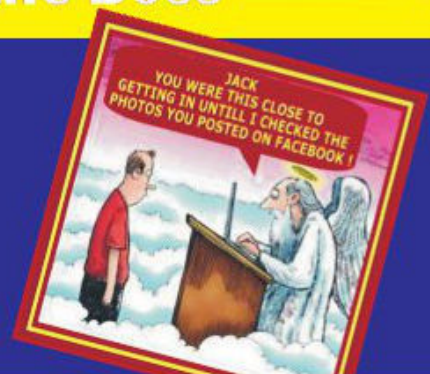

“EGG IN TOAST BASKET”

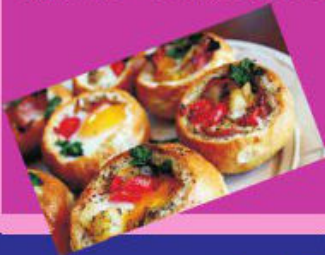
Ingredients...

- Sliced whole-wheat or rye bread
- Eggs
- Tomato
- Salt & pepper
- Deep muffin pan



Preparation...

- Line your muffin cups or a muffin pan with a slice of bread – push it in that it fits snugly
- Bake at 180°C in oven until lightly toasted
- Fill your breadbasket with one whole cracked raw egg. Top the yolk with a slice of tomato [or leave plain]
- Bake 10 – 15 minutes or until the egg is done to your liking & season to taste

Top with grated cheese!

Spread basil on bread before lining the bread in the muffin tray
